The **National Bank of Poland** is the sole issuer of Polish notes. The Polish banknotes have been designed to make checking their authenticity easy and fast.

Each banknote, regardless of its face value, incorporates the following elements:

- the portrait of a Polish king
- the national emblem of the Republic of Poland
- the face value in words and digits
- signatures of the President of the NBP and the General Treasurer of the NBP
- the name of the issuer: the National Bank of Poland

At present, there are five banknotes in circulation throughout Poland. There are part of the “**Sovereigns of Poland**” series and have values of 10, 20, 50, 100 and 200 zł.

Our advice

Always check...

- banknotes showing wear and tear and those received in poorly lit places
- several security features – don't rely on just one

If in doubt, compare the banknote with one you know to be genuine.

If you believe a banknote is counterfeit...

- do not pass it on – it is a criminal offence to keep it in circulation
- have its authenticity verified at the nearest police station or a bank
